DISCLAIMER: The following is only a general guideline. There are many different factors that will cause differences in the outcomes, including earned time eligibility and the behavior of the inmate.

Sentences for convictions of 2^{nd} degree murder, 1^{st} degree Kidnapping (not class 1 felony), 1^{st} degree Assault, 1^{st} degree Arson, 1^{st} degree Burglary, Aggravated Robbery, and older convictions for 1^{st} or 2^{nd} Degree Sexual Assault are subject to parole eligibility calculation at 75% of the sentence, possibly without eligibility for earned time reduction. All other convictions (including attempts, conspiracies, accessories, or solicitations for the above listed crimes) are parole eligible beginning at 50% of the sentence, and earned time granted will reduce the parole eligibility date.

1. Simple formula for figuring earliest possible parole eligibility for 50% calculations:

<u>Length of sentence</u> times $\underline{.35} = \underline{\text{Earliest possible parole eligibility}}$

Latest possible parole eligibility: 100% of sentence if institutional behavior is bad.

2. Simple formula for figuring earliest possible parole eligibility for 75% calculations with eligibility for earned time:

<u>Length of sentence</u> times <u>.55</u> = Earliest parole eligibility

Simple formula for figuring earliest possible parole eligibility for 75% calculations if not eligible for earned time:

<u>Length of sentence</u> times <u>.75</u> = <u>Earliest parole eligibility</u>

Latest possible parole eligibility for any 75% sentence: 100% of sentence if institutional behavior is bad.
